# MAKING PUBLIC SCHOOL FREE

We believe that access to public education is a fundamental right.

The current average cost of the annual materials and services charge is \$382 for primary students and \$723 for secondary students.

We know this creates pressure on family budgets – especially alongside other school costs like uniforms and laptops.

And we want to make it easier for South Australian families.

**That's why the Malinauskas Labor Government is taking to the election a bold and nation-leading plan to abolish public school fees, starting from the 2027 school year.**

This policy will save South Australian families \$300 million over the next four years, including an extra \$148 million on top of our existing investment of \$152 million to fund the school card program and the \$200 material and services charge rebate for all school students.

This means that each South Australian family with a child in public schooling will save on average more than \$8,000 per child over their 13 years of schooling.

This money will go straight back into the pockets of families, providing immediate cost-of-living relief.

We believe that essential public services should be accessible to all and our plan will deliver just that.

## DELIVERED

### Doubled the School Sports Voucher

Doubled the School Sports Voucher to 2 x \$100 vouchers per school age child, and expanded it to include music lessons.



### **School Materials and Services Fee Discount**

School materials and services fee discount - \$100 discount in 2022, 2023 and 2024 – and double that discount to \$200 in 2025.



### **School Excursion Support Program**

A 2025 school excursion support program – for drought affected regional families on a school card with a year 7 child.



### **Discounted computers**

Discounted school computers – enabling families to purchase computers, with a saving of up to \$200.



### **School Breakfast Expansion**

School breakfast \$6.5 million expansion - allowing more state government schools to run a breakfast program five days a week.



### **Student MetroCARD**

Student MetroCARD - \$10 travel for 28 days, or 25c a trip, for students using an Adelaide MetroCard.



### **Learning for Life Program**

Learning for Life program - \$4 million to the Smith Family to support an extra 700 families every year with tutoring and education costs.



### **Free Laptops for high school students on School Card**

Free laptops for high school students in years 7 and 10 for families on school card. This program will continue under a modified school card scheme with existing income thresholds maintained.

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
